Supplies Needed:

Wool-

- 10" X 10" orange plaid (pumpkin)
- 4" x 4" gold hand dyed (sunflower)
- 4" x 4" gold herringbone hand dyed (sunflower)
- 2" x 4" brown (sunflower center)
- 21/2" x 6" neutral texture (windows)
- 2" x 12" green plaid (puddle)
- 5" x 5" black texture (top hat and door)
- 4" x 5" black (top hat brim & window hats)
- 1" x 10" brown pole (sígn pole)
- 21/2" x 3" black (cat)

Cotton-

5/8 yard - plaid homespun (background) 2" x 4 1/2" scrap - aged muslin (Hat Haus Sign)

5/8 yard - backing and binding (optional)

Threads-

Eleganza 100% Egyptían 8 wt. Perle Cotton:

- · 28 Royal Robes
- 2120 Olive
- 2232 earthy brown
- 2233 Tarníshed Black

Helpful Items-

- Heat N Bond Light Paper backed fusible
- · Chalk Marker
- · Appli-Fuse Mat

Pumpkin Village-Hat Haus

Fíníshed Síze: 12" Square





Instructions:

- Cut a 13" square from the plaid homespun
- Trace appliqué shapes on paper side of fusible
- · Cut roughly around shapes
- · Fuse shapes to wool and cut out the shapes.
- Arrange applique in place overlapping where necessary.
 (Check out the video on our face book page showing the use of the Appli-Fuse Mat for placement of wool applique pieces)
- Fuse applique to your background block.
- · Chalk the vine to wrap around the sign pole
- Using perle cotton thread, stitch as suggested in the Stitching Chart.
- Press and trim your block to 12 1/2" square.
- Your block is ready to add to the Woolie Friends Pumpkin Village project or you can back and bind it if you choose to make this a stand alone project.







Helpful tips:



I stitched my sign to a scrap of fabric. This allowed me to put it in a hoop to do my back stitched letters.



Taper the length of the fly stitch to make your feather.

I must admit I watched a You tube video to learn the Bullion stitch to make the flowers. Add a few Lazy Daisy stitches for the leaves.



Draw a stitching line to follow while doing your Chain stitch around the sign.



Add a pom pom made from the green & purple threads to add to the tip of the hat. (optional)
